The Women Educating Women scholarship of \$500.00 will be awarded to a woman residing in Christian County. Applicants may be a high school junior or senior, high school graduate, GED recipient, or enrolled in a postsecondary program. Applicants must have a minimum GPA of 2.0 thus far in their educational pursuits. The scholarship must be used for postsecondary education expenses during the 2019-2020 academic year.

Attach the following to this form to be considered for this scholarship:

- 1) **Academic transcript** or proof of receiving a GED
- 2) **Resumé** (Include all work history, community involvement, and extra-curricular activities.)
- 3) **Typed essay** of 400 words or less that describes your view of the importance of women's right to vote. Essays will be judged on writing skills, originality and the clarity of the answer.

Applications must be received by the close of business on **Feb. 28, 2020**.
