

# PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS, Domestic violence impacts women, men, and children of every age, background, and belief with nearly 1 in 4 women and 1 in 7 men in the United States having suffered severe physical violence by an intimate partner; and

WHEREAS, Domestic Violence Awareness Month evolved from the "Day of Unity" held in October 1981, conceived by the National Coalition Against Domestic Violence with the intent to connect advocates across the nation who were working to end violence against women and their children; and

WHEREAS, The Day of Unity soon became an entire week devoted to a range of activities conducted at the local, state, and national levels with the common themes of mourning those who have died because of domestic violence, celebrating those who have survived, and connecting those who work to end violence, which further evolved to the first Domestic Violence Awareness Month, observed in October 1987, and annually since that time; and




